Year 7

Next Thursday, 21 September, we have an opportunity for Year 7 parents and carers to spend some time with their child's mentor before the Information Evening talk. I have sent further information out separately to parents and carers of Year 7.

Attendance

It is a recognised fact that outcomes in school are far higher for an individual student when their attendance is good. We know that nationally attendance at school has not yet recovered post pandemic and this is a real concern both at Government and individual school level. Every percentage point drop in attendance is equivalent to almost 2 days of school missed, so even 95% attendance in a year is 9 and a half days or 48 lessons missed.

Please send your child into school unless it is unavoidable. The Government has produced a document called 'Is my child too ill for school' which gives advice to parents and carers on a range of illnesses and when a child can and should still attend school.
