School Transport - Warton

Road works in Warton will affect 602, 603 and 639 school service commencing Monday 26th February for 3 weeks resulting in possible delays.

639 AND 602 start as usual from Lytham travel through Warton to Freckleton. The Warton stop at Whites is temporarily shut so pick up in Warton will be at 2 stops - the Old Post Office at Townsend Garage and Mill Lane Warton.

603 will not pick up in Warton and will start from the bus stop opposite Lamaleach Drive, Freckleton.
