Open Evening

Yesterday evening we had a fantastic Open Evening and have received great feedback from many visitors to the school. School Shop

Detentions

As a reminder, detentions are normally given the same day if issued before 1.30 p.m. Detentions by definition are meant to be an inconvenience but it is also better to get them done with so a fresh start can be had the next day. Detentions are in half hour sessions from 3.15 – 3.45, 3.45 – 4.15 and 4.45 – 4.45 p.m. if someone was to be given three detentions in a day. Most students in detention are only there for the first half hour. Any student who fails to attend will be given a Head's detention which is either Tuesday or Friday till 5.00 p.m. We will not rearrange detentions at the request of a student and would ask your support in ensuring they are done the same day unless absolutely unavoidable.



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School Buses

If students have a pass with a school bus number on it then they are expected to catch that specific bus and can be refused access to any other bus. We expect the highest standards of behaviour on the buses and students need to be aware that passes can be withdrawn or they can be banned from using a bus if behaviour on a bus is unacceptable.
