## **Dear Parents and Carers**

Welcome back to a new academic year. It has been lovely to see our students return. We have been joined by 186 new students in Year 7, some new students in other year groups and we are fully staffed.

Obviously the issue of RAAC concrete in schools has been dominating the news. Our buildings are now quite old and are regularly surveyed but as far as we are aware there is no RAAC in the school.

The catering service would like to remind you that the cost of meals has increased from 1 September with a meal deal now costing £2.50. A list of prices is attached to this letter. Currently we have a £5 spending cap per day for students who might purchase items at break time as well as lunch. If you wish to increase this spending cap for your son or daughter please contact the finance office in school.

PE lessons have resumed and I would like to remind you that there is a strong recommendation that students wear protective items — shin pads for football; mouth guard and scrum cap for rugby; and shin pads and mouth guard for hockey. Mr Haydock has already sent a broadcast with a timetable of after school sport opportunities next week. The whole school extra-curricular offer will be sent out next week.

The vast majority of our students have returned looking very smart and wearing the correct uniform as it should be. Please remember that we do not allow make-up, false tan, fake eye lashes or nail extensions; shoes should be black school shoes and not trainers — students can expect a detention if they are not complying with uniform expectations and sanctions will increase if the issue is not corrected. We make no apologies for having high expectations.

We want to reward and praise students for getting it right in and out of the classroom and Mr Long is now responsible for leading on this in school. Unfortunately, a minority sometimes make the wrong choices and detentions this year will be in the new dining room and given on the same day. We will inform you via synergy by 2pm if your son or daughter is in detention (or multiple detentions) which now are in 3 time slots:
