Welcome to the final newsletter of the Autumn term.

First of all there has been a lot of news reports around Scarlett Fever and Strep A. The latest advice we have been given for parents from the UK Health Security Agency is attached.

#### **Edenred Vouchers**

As I said last week, the Local Authority is funding vouchers for students in receipt of free school meals. These will be sent in the normal manner and families will receive a voucher for £30 per student to cover the two week holiday.

### Year 11

Year 11 students now only have a couple of school weeks left before mock exams in January. They should be doing at least 10 hours of study outside of the classroom whether that be additional classes, personal revision or using resources such as Seneca and GCSE Pods. Students have to recognise that effort put in, has an impact on outcomes and so they should be using at least part of the Christmas Holidays to revise. The mocks are an important stage in preparing for the summer exams which are completely back to prepandemic arrangements.

Year 11 students should also have made applications for Post 16 provision or be in the process of doing so. The Local Authority has produced a transition guide with all the necessary contacts in and this is attached to the broadcast.
