## **Covid matters:**

- As you aware the Government yesterday lifted the recommendation for students to wear face coverings in class and we applied this straight away
- Students and staff are still asked to wear face coverings in other communal areas until Thursday January 27<sup>th</sup> when this recommendation will be removed.
- The vaccine team will be in school on February 3<sup>rd</sup> to continue the covid vaccine roll out for 12-16 year olds. There will therefore be an additional two days of mock exams on Thursday 27<sup>th</sup> and Friday 28<sup>th</sup> January. Please encourage your sons and daughters to prepare for these if they missed any exams.

The results of the mock exams will be reported home on Friday February 11<sup>th</sup> but it is really important that students in Year 11 are positively focussed on the remaining 5 months and want to achieve the very best for themselves. Staff are working hard to prepare them for exams but every Year 11 needs to be focussed and be putting in the work themselves if they are going to achieve. They should be doing two hours work a night as a minimum and are kidding themselves if they think 'they can just get by'. In light of the Prime minister's announcements yesterday I think we can say we can say with almost absolute certainty that exams will go ahead. Year 11 have had three years disruption but so has every other Year 11 student in the country and they are all competing for the grades.
