Impact of BAe Competition which we currently run in school with Year 9

<u>The CREATE Education Project</u> and <u>BAE Systems</u> have been working together to deliver the Inspiring Lancashire Programme to schools across Lancashire, and we have been lucky enough to be a part of it.

To date, the <u>Inspiring Lancashire Programme</u> has given Carr Hill pupils the opportunity to access STEM industry critical skills through the use of Additive Manufacturing technology - and it's official - it's had a huge impact!

Starting in October 2021, BAE Systems initially invested £150,000 which enabled CREATE Education to provide 52 secondary schools in Lancashire with 3D printers, software and materials, training for teachers, careers workshops for students and a Design Challenge, which saw the finalists visit BAE Systems for a tour of their inspiring facility in Samlesbury.

This month CREATE Education launched its Year 1 Impact Report and the results have been outstanding.

- 70% of students participating said that this project made them consider their Key Stage 4 options leading to a job in science, technology or engineering.
- 98% of teachers participating said the school workshops had improved or significantly improved the development of new and specialist digital skills with learners.
- 96% of teachers participating said the school workshops had generated a positive change in learner attitudes.
- 100% of teachers participating said the learners had made a connection to how the school workshops could impact on future life chances

Such has been the extent of the impact that BAE Systems has committed to a further £500,000 investment over the next three years to extend the Inspiring Lancashire Programme, providing access to new technology, further teacher training and more student workshops.

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In addition, this investment has enabled the programme to be extended into primary education, reaching up to 18,000 young people, growing their skills and inspiring them around STEM subjects.

The impact of the programme has been recognised by the BETT Awards. These prestigious education awards are hard fought in the sector, and CREATE Education won the 'Collaboration with a School/Schools' for the Inspiring Lancashire Programme. They also were shortlisted as finalists in the Education Resource Awards 2023.
